1. Russian Military Opened Fire on an Israeli Aircraft.

19.12.2019 Russia has allegedly opened fire on Israeli aircraft that entered Syria's airspace in the southwestern part of the country, the Hebrew-language website Channel 12 reported. Citing the website Top War, the Channel 12 report said the Russian military opened fire on an Israeli unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) that was along the eastern axis of the occupied Golan Heights region. 
4. Russia and Iran Get Closer on Security.

Latest joint naval drill with participation of Russian and Syrian navies marks a new stage in Russian ambitions in the Eastern Mediterranean in the post-Syrian war era. In order to ensure its presence and legitimacy in the region, Russia is and will likely use every tool to introduce Syria as a sovereign state among international community.

Turkey seems to lose the initiative completely to Russia in Idlib region and will try to take measures against the soon expected refugee flows to hit its borders. Within the same context, Erdogan will likely exploit this opportunity to blackmail Western States as he reiterated his claims that Western States betrayed Turkey concerning the support for refugees during the Global Refugee Forum in Geneva.

Additionally, Erdogan's proposal to use Syrian oil revenues to support Turkish safe zone plan is far from reality as the possession of Syrian oil fields is still one of the hot topics in the region.

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6. At least 25,000 people fled Syria's Idlib for Turkey over two days - media.

22.12.2019 At least 25,000 civilians have fled Syria's northwestern region of Idlib and headed towards Turkey over the past two days, Turkish state media said on Sunday, as Syrian and Russian forces intensified their bombardment of the region. Syrian President Bashar al-Assad has vowed to recapture Idlib, pushing more people towards Turkey. On Thursday, Turkish President Tayyip Erdogan said 50,000 people were fleeing from Idlib towards Syria's border with Turkey. (Reuters) https://reut.rs/36YWBIB

7. Lack of refugee aid forced Turkey into Syria operation: Erdogan.

17.12.2019 A lack of international assistance to Turkey to support millions of refugees on its soil pushed Ankara to launch operations in northeast Syria, Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan said Tuesday. Despite broad international criticism, Turkish forces in October launched a major cross-border raid to clear a so-called safe-zone of Kurdish fighters, who Ankara considers "terrorists". "Nobody seems inclined to help us," Erdogan told international leaders gathered for a Global Refugee Forum in Geneva. "When we haven't received the support we needed from the international community, we had to take care of our own self," he said of Turkey's operations into northern Syria since 2016. 8. EU condemns Turkey again while sticking to its position on the Kurdish administration in north-east Syria.

17.12.2019 An international conference took place last week in the European Parliament on the deteriorating humanitarian and military situation in North-East Syria following the Turkish invasion in beginning of October. The conference ended with a strongly worded condemnation of the invasion and a call to the EU and the international community to recognise the Autonomous Administration in the region (Rojava) and include it in the UN-led Constitutional Committee tasked to draft a new constitution for Syria. 
4. Turkey agrees to NATO Baltic defense plan after Syria rift.

Like as his previous ones Erdogan's new statements concerning to stall NATO's Baltic defense proposal were nothing more than a political game to increase its shrinking domestic support in Turkey. However, YPG seems to be the one benefited from this situation by not only refuting the thesis of Turkey that YPG is a terrorist organization but also consolidating its legitimacy among NATO member states. Besides, Turkish support to the Jihadi groups was told out louder by NATO Allies.

Israeli attacks targeting Iranian forces might escalate in harmony with the increasing intercourse between Israel and Russia. It is crystal clear that both sides are uncomfortable with the growing Iranian influence in Syria and looking for ways to diminish it.

Turkey continue consolidating its presence by establishing police forces in the occupied areas of Northern Syria in line with the increasing presence of Russia but most importantly Syrian Regime throughout Turkish-Syrian frontier which were previously controlled by YPG.

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6. Turkey to appoint 4,000 police officers to Syria.

07.12.2019 Turkey will be appointing 4,000 urban and rural police officers in Ras al Ayn and Tel Abyad in northern Syria, the governorate of southeastern border province of Şanlıurfa said in a statement. Turkish forces had taken control of the two Syrian towns as per the Sochi Accord Turkey signed with Russia, following its Operation Peace Spring into the Kurdish-controlled territories in northern Syria in October. Şanlıurfa Governor Abdullah Erin said in a meeting in Tel Abyad Turkish security forces would start training some 1,800 Syrian men within the week. 
4. Leaders of Turkey, Germany, France & Britain to discuss Syria before NATO summit.


4. Man who filmed beheading of Syrian identified as Russian mercenary.

While all parties are focused on Northern Syria, Israel continues its strikes targeting Iranian elements, which it considers as a threat to its security, despite of Russian warnings. Latest Israeli air strikes reveal its determination that it will never tolerate Iranian presence in Syria.

Although Russia says that YPG members left the safe zone in Northern Syria, Turkey seems not to be convinced with the Russian statements. Following unsuccessful negotiations with the US, Turkey seems also not happy with its new ally, Russia, in Syria concerning the safe zone agreement. Amid ongoing recrimination among parties, Turkey threatens to resume its operation that in reality has never stopped by means of proxies.

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6. Russian and Syrian government forces kill 14 civilians in Idlib strikes.

20.11.2019 Syrian coalition forces killed at least 14 civilians, including eight children, in strikes on Idlib province, a UK-based activist and monitoring group said. Syrian President Bashar al-Assad's forces, using ground-to-ground missiles, on Wednesday killed at least eight civilians, including four children, in an attack on a makeshift camp for the displaced outside Qah village, near the Turkish border, the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights said. 

Russia continues to consolidate its presence in Northern Syria by deploying its troops and aircrafts into the bases abandoned by the US forces. Although denied by Russian officials latest news concerning the establishment of a new Russian Air Base in Qamishli reveals Russia's long lasting ambition to extend its influence all through NATO's southern borders thanks to a NATO member state, Turkey, which shows the success of Russian diplomacy.

Both the US and Turkey seem happy regarding their agreement on the ISIL captives issue. While the US gets rid of the burden of captured ISIL terrorists, Turkey gains a very important blackmailing asset against Europe especially. It is highly likely that Turkey will deport more ISIL terrorist in the near future until Erdogan gets what he wants from the EU capitals.

7. Russia seems set to establish new military base in northeast Syria.





Despite Erdogan's statements that he didn't make a fuss like Trump concerning the capture of Bagdadi's wife, it seems that Erdogan makes effort to defuse strong criticism against himself within US public and strengthen Trump's hand before his visit to US. It is highly likely that convergence of Russian and Turkish policies in Syria will be the main topic during discussions.

Accusations between the US and Turkish sides continue. While US side is blaming Turkey for using the US arms against SDF, Turkey states that US is financing SDF with the oil revenues. On the other hand, Macron criticizes Turkey for undermining Alliance's solidarity by acting without consulting to NATO Allies. Russia appears to get the best out of the quarrel.

6. US Uses Syria's Oil to Support Kurdish Forces: Turkey.

09.11.2019 Turkey has strongly blamed the US for using the Syria's oilfields to support the Kurdish forces in the Middle Eastern country, saying that Washington has not hidden the fact. ASSESSMENT

Having all parties focused on Northern Syria, Idlib area seems to remain calm except some clashes in Latakia. However, latest offensive by Jihadi Groups in Latakia reveals that they are still capable to carry out effective operations against Regime forces and control the territory.

Despite so called ceasefire sporadic clashes continue between Turkish backed groups and SDF and Regime forces . Capturing of 18 regime soldiers and killing several of them by Turkish backed groups shows that tension in the region still very high and the agreement is still fragile. Before the deadline of 150 hours arrived Russia continued to reinforce its forces in the region, in order to prevent possible future clashes between parties.

After taking over the responsibility of the ISIL captives from the U.S., Turkey is highly likely to exploit them as a valuable asset to blackmail the Western countries. Latest statements by the Turkish Interior Minister saying that Turkey will send them to their home countries can be seen as a clear evidence of it.

U.S. bill imposing sanctions on Turkey over Syria, especially the ones targeting the assets of Erdogan family and his inner circle, gives the opportunity to Russia strengthen its ties with Turkey and consolidate its influence in the region.

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7. Russia sends additional forces and armored vehicles to northern Syria.

02.11.2019 The Russian Defense Ministry has transferred additional forces and armored vehicles to northern Syria to participate in joint patrols of border areas with Turkey in accordance with the Russian-Turkish agreement, reports RIA Novosti. About 300 military police personnel and 20 armored vehicles have reportedly been deployed to northern Syria to participate in joint patrols with the Turks. According to the agreement, daily Russian military police patrols will take place in at least ten settlements on pre-determined routes, the development and approval of which is currently being carried out jointly with the Turkish side. 

Conflicting statements from the U.S. officials and the President Trump concerning the presence and the numbers of U.S. troops reveal the continuing disagreement which paves the way for Russia and Syria consolidate their power in Northern Syria. On the other hand, Trump's statement about securing the oil fields from possible ISIL attacks gives the clear message that Russian and Syrian presence should be limited to Northern Syria.

Although the details surrounding the operation are still emerging, questions still remain particularly regarding Baghdadi's location very closed to the Turkish border and involvement of different parties such as Kurdish militias, Iraqi intelligence service in the operation. Furthermore, the biggest question is operational capacity and future intentions of autonomous and self-financing ISIL cells which might not be suffered from Baghdadi's death.

Despite hard criticism from individual NATO member states, NATO has no choice but to declare solidarity with Turkey as it still uses its Russian and as well as refugee card to blackmail the Alliance and the EU. Additionally, Germany's proposal to establish an international force for the safe zone is something late since Germany was among those objecting the U.S. demands for additional troops.

Agreement between Russia and Turkey is a clear success of the Russian diplomacy. Russia not only got the upper hand and stopped Turkish advance but also force Turkey to recognize Assad as the legitimate party. Emphasizing on Adana agreement also leaves the door open to force Turkey later to withdraw its forces from the occupied territories when the region is secured from terrorist threat. Accordingly, it would not be a surprise to see PYD/YPG militias wearing Syrian regime military uniforms and turning back to the Northern Syria.

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6. Turkey rejects German defense minister's Syria 'security zone' proposal.

25.10.2019 German Foreign Minister Heiko Maas was in Turkey on Saturday for talks with his Turkish counterpart, Mevlut Cavusoglu, in Ankara, where he pressed the Turkish government for a durable cease-fire in northeastern Syria. 

-Turkish Operation Peace Spring continues in full swing amid fierce criticism from international community and contradictory statements by different U.S. officials. However, there is no substance beyond ostentatious remarks or statements. Because, parties to the incursion benefit from this situation in one way or another. Noting there is no place for romanticism in the international relations, the reasons for these comments are as follows:

- President Trump fulfills his promise to bring back US soldiers from conflict zones that have no benefit to the Americans. In his own words, from "stupid endless wars" in the Middle East.
- Assad and Putin limit Kurdish territorial gains in the Northeastern Syria. Instead of using force after leveling Idlib, they will inherit control of the region from Turkish forces. Based on incursion, Kurds will consent to Assad's terms. In the end, the regime will likely appear as the savior of the Kurds and re-consolidate its legitimacy within international community. Russia enjoys testing limits of NATO when an Ally takes unilateral action much to the distaste of all other Allies, coming as a continuation to a full series of actions exhibiting slide of axis of the country towards East.
- The greatest beneficiary, Erdogan uses this incursion to:
- a. Get rid of the biggest issue that decrease rate of votes he gets: Syrian refugees
- b. Consolidate support (real or pretended) to his regime from electors and parliament by creating a rally-around-the flag effect through a war-like situation, a tactic that has served him well on multiple occasions so far.

 c. Finds excuse / pretext to attribute reasons of economic failures to external powers' sanctions, statements, threats.
- The losers in this theatrical performance are the Kurds and the EU. The former is obvious reasons. The second is being sacrificed to a political game between Trump, Erdogan, Putin and Assad to bear the consequences of this act and Erdogan's threats to allow millions of Syrian refugees pass to Europe, the greatest fear used by European politicians to show how clever they are and how well they manage the issue to ask for more votes.
- As Israel has great concerns over Iran's role in the region, apparently Israeli interests and those of the US are not fully
 aligned in this initiative. Israel itself and its diaspora will likely increase pressure on the US to do more in Syria and increase
 its efforts to break the Iranian influence and exoel Iranian proxies.

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6. France and Germany halt arms exports to Turkey over Syria offensive.


4. Russian Air Force carries out strategic attack to eliminate Al-Qaeda bases in Idlib.

- Following a phone call with Erdogan, White House expressed consent to a probable Turkish operation to Northeastern Syria that will allow Turkish troops establish a safe zone 20-30 kilometers in the immediate south of its borders with Syria. Accordingly Turkey will take responsibility of 11K+ ISIL militants, 70K ISIL family members currently under SDF managed camps and detention centers. Erdogan promised to move more than 1 million Syrians living in Turkey to this safe zone and cleanse borders from terrorist elements.
- The probable motivations behind this move may be to defuse pressure within Turkish society against Syrian refugees and increase historic low popular support to Erdogan rule by attracting nationalist and conservative votes.
- The operation will be conducted after US troops in the region are pulled which is assessed will take some two weeks. It will highly likely be limited to YPG abandoned areas, as recommended by the U.S., and will not face any serious resistance which was the case in Afrin.
- This move has potential to push Kurds ally with Assad. But one thing that is certain is that US leave the Syrian theater to Russians.

6. Turkey Sponsors Unification of 'Moderate Factions' in North Syria.

05.10.2019 Ankara sponsored on Friday the unification of "moderate opposition factions" operating in north Syria under the umbrella of the Syrian National Army. The move is expected to pave the way for dismantling Hayat Tahrir al-Sham, an al-Qaeda offshoot previously known as al-Nusra Front, and which controls large swaths of territory throughout Idlib province. 

- -After the announcement of a new agreement between Syrian Regime and opposition, Turkey has to play it safe since any kind of aggression against Syrian territory will be seen as breach of the peace process by international community. Additionally, Erdogan's failure to meet with Trump during the UN General Assembly reveals that Erdogan's blackmailing about safe zone seems to be neglected by the U.S. side.
- Turkey is likely aiming to receive support from international community by driving the idea to provide safe housing to Syrian refugees forward and use it as a pretext to legitimize its ambitions to create a safe stretching across its southern borders.



- At the end of the day, it seems that Esad would regain the control of Idlib. Nevertheless he should not take it for granted as the Syrian Army and pro-Syrian forces together do not have enough power. He still has to rely on Russian and Iranian support both of which are likely to continue, though limited and with a focus on their own priorities such as protecting Khmeimim (Russian) Air Base.
- It is crystal clear that Turkish and Russian interests in Syria are completely different. Russian actions on the field manifests this brightly despite the positive messages given to the media by both states' officials.
- As we assessed before, Turkey can not commence an operation and set up a safe zone without a green light from the US. Still, Erdogan continue his rhetoric for domestic politics to boost up his support.

6. Jihadists use force to block civilians from fleeing to government areas in Idlib.

20.09.2019 For six straight days, the jihadist rebels from Hay'at Tahrir Al-Sham have blocked civilians from fleeing to the government- held areas in the Idlib Governorate. According to a new report from the neighbouring Hama Governorate, several civilians were targeted with gunfire by Hay'at Tahrir Al-Sham militants near the Abu Dhuhour Crossing. 7. Jihadi groups still refuse to withdraw from the "demilitarized" area.

9. Syria summit demonstrates Turkey's growing dependence on Russia.



ASSESSMENT

Putin's statement concerning the prevention of Israeli airstrikes in Syria is his first significant/unreserved objection. This might related to the Israeli elections, aiming to help Netanyahu to boost his nationalist votes in order to avoid any unpredictable political changes in Israel which would not be in favor of Russia.

Russia accelerates its political efforts to encourage the international community to join the reconstruction of Syria as the arms conflict will come to an end in the near future. Russians know that the legitimacy of the Assad regime and the stability of the country highly depends on the level of the support from the international actors.

5. New checkpoint opened in Idlib de-escalation zone in Syria.

14.09.2019 According to the chief of the Russian center for reconciliation of conflicting sides in Syria Alexei Bakin, the militants who were unwilling to surrender are continuing to break the ceasefire. The Syrian government ensured the functioning of the humanitarian corridor and the Abu al-Duhur checkpoint starting on September 13, so that civilians could leave the Idlib de-escalation zone and so that militants from the zone could lay down arms, Major General Alexei Bakin, the chief of the Russian center for reconciliation of conflicting sides in Syria, told reporters on Saturday. "Starting on September 13, the Syrian government provided operation of a humanitarian corridor and the Abu al-Duhur checkpoint for the civilian population's voluntary and unimpeded exit from the Idlib de-escalation zone and for those militants who are willing to surrender arms," Bakin said. "Points providing urgent treatment, drinking water, hot meals, medicines and daily necessities were equipped for those who are fleeing the area controlled by illegal armed groups. 

Erdogan continues to blackmail the U.S. concerning the quick establishment of a safe zone in North Eastern Syria. However, this time around Turkey has no chance but to compromise with the U.S. as North Eastern Syria completely differs from the previous operation areas of Turkey due to U.S. presence in the region.

The U.S. air operations in Idlib is likely aiming to give a clear message to Russian and Turkish sides that even in Idlib they are not alone and they have to consider that the U.S. is still in the game.

6. Moscow Concerned, Puzzled Over US Airstrike in Syria's Idlib.

02.09.2019 The Russian Foreign Ministry said in a statement on Monday that it was concerned and puzzled by Washington's recent airstrike in Syria's Idlib, slamming the move as "inconsistent" and "contradictory." 

Having learned from Manbic example Turkey seems to agree on the U.S proposal concerning the depth of the safe zone in order not to lose the window of opportunity this time around.

7. Syria war: US missile strike on 'al-Qaeda leaders' in Idlib.



ASSESSMENT

There is a clear temporal correlation between the U.S.-Turkey Agreement and the increasing tempo of the regime offensive. Turkey's shift in its strategic orientation left her in limbo. Just for an example, Turkey has a dilemma to allocate sufficient military power to the East of Euphrates (to the Kurds) or to the West of Euphrates (to her prior commitments to Russia). Syrian Air Force attack to Turkish convoy is a clear message from Russia against the recent U.S.-Turkey Agreement on safe zone and joint operation center. Possible refugee flow, the safety of Turkish forces in Idlib and safe zone will likely be the main topics of the surprise meeting between Erdogan and Putin.

M5 highway connecting from Damascus to Aleppo will highly likely be the axis of advance of the possible Syrian offensive in Idlib. If manages to control the M5 highway, Syrian regime will easily control the rest of the Idlib area and consolidate its control in North Western Syria.

5. Turkey says air strike hit Syria convoy, killed three.

19.08.2019 Turkey said an air strike on a Turkish military convoy in northwest Syria killed three civilians and wounded 12 on Monday as Syrian troops advanced against rebels inside a key town. Syrian government air strikes hit near the convoy that was approaching front lines in Idlib province, two Turkey-backed rebel sources and a war monitor said. (Reuters) https://reut.rs/2HoQe7e

According to a local report, the Syrian convoy, which was comprised of mostly military personnel from the National Defense Forces (NDF), were traveling along this roadway when a group of Islamic State terrorists ambushed their troops. 
3. Russian Ship Carrying Heavy Military Equipment, Tanks Heading to Syria.

Regime operations, backed by Russian air support in greater Idlib area, continues increasingly. Lasting Russian LST (Landing Ship Tank) traffic in Tartus port reveals a possible large scale offensive against the Rebel and Jihadi forces in Idlib.

Recent agreement between the U.S. and Turkey, concerning a safe zone in Northern Syria seems to progress faster than expected. However, in the light of previous agreement between two NATO Allies in Munbic, Turkey should not expect a quick solution in the near future. The joint operation centre is likely nothing more than to gain time and try to calm down the Turkish side.

The 13th round of meetings on Syria was focused on the situation in Idlib, the last rebel-held enclave in Syria, and northern Syria controlled by U.S.-backed Kurdish forces, as well as the situation in northern Syria, where Kurdish-led autonomous areas are under threat of Turkish attack. An agreement signed by Turkey and Russia last September prevented regime attacks on the province, which is home to an estimated 3 million people, including hundreds of thousands of refugees. Assad regime forces backed by Russia have launched intensive bombing and ground attacks this year on Idlib after Moscow said Turkey had failed to live up to its agreement to remove "extremist" opposition groups from the agreement's de-escalation zone in southern Idlib. 

In the light of previous truce decisions between the Regime and the rebel groups, new truce attempt in Idlib is unlikely to last long as Idlib contains several different groups with several different ideologies and backers. With the latest truce decision Syrian regime is likely aiming to alleviate increasing level of criticism by the international community and blame rebel or terrorist groups for any violation of ceasefire. Additionally, reorganizing its troops ahead of a decisive offensive might be another reason.

Even the Turkish government decides to launch an offensive to establish a safe zone in Northern Syria, it is highly unlikely to take a unilateral action without having an agreement with the U.S. in the region.

5. Damascus Accepts New Ceasefire in Greater Idlib.

01.08.2019 In a surprise move, Damascus accepted a new ceasefire in Greater Idlib, despite the recent Syrian Arab Army (SAA) advance in the terrorist-occupied region. The Syrian Arab News Agency (SANA) announced the ceasefire in a press release late on August 1. A military source told the state-run agency that the ceasefire will be implemented as long as Idlib's militants remain committed to the demilitarized zone agreement. (AMN) https://bit.ly/2yDylwt

6. Turkish-Backed Militants to not Fulfil Demilitarized Zone Agreement Demands.

03.08.2019 In an official statement, the Turkish-backed coalition openly said that it will take advantage of the ceasefire to train and reorganize its members. "We will rest our arms and give our fighter the opportunity to heal their wounds, to accommodate their families, to prepare and train for what's yet to come while our hand remains on the trigger to respond to any foolish act our enemy could think of," the statement reads. The NFL followed the footsteps of its key ally, Hay'at Tahrir al-Sham (HTS), completely ignoring the terms of the Sochi agreement which are essential for the success of the ceasefire. 7. Explosions in al-Shayrat Airbase kill more than 30 members of the regime forces.

03.08.2019 The death toll continues to rise to more than 30 due to the violent explosions in the ammunition explosion in al-Shayrat Airbase in the southeastern countryside of Homs. The death toll is expected to rise because there are some of the wounded are in critical situation, The causes of the explosion are still unknown whether it was fabricated, caused by targeting, or by a technical defect. 8. Turkey to launch offensive in Kurdish-controlled area in northern Syria.

04.08.2019 Turkey will carry out a military operation in a Kurdish-controlled area east of the Euphrates in northern Syria, Turkish President Tayyip Erdogan said on Sunday, its third offensive to dislodge Kurdish militia fighters close to its border. Erdogan said both Russia and the United States have been told of the planned operation, but did not say when it would begin. It would mark the third Turkish incursion into Syria in as many years. 9. Turkish Security Council Mulls Syrian Operation, Despite Washington's Warnings.

30.07.2019 Turkey's National Security Council met Tuesday to decide whether to launch a military offensive into Syria against the YPG Kurdish militia. With Washington backing the YPG and warning against any unilateral action, the two NATO allies could be on a collision course. President Recep Tayyip Erdogan chaired the meeting, which brought together his military and intelligence chiefs. 1. Israel missile strike targets Syria military positions near Golan Heights.

24.07.2019 An Israeli missile attack targeted Syrian military positions held by the government and its allies early on Wednesday, July 24, Syria's state news agency said. The missiles were fired into the south of the country close to the Golan Heights, an area of Syria occupied and annexed by Israel. "The Israeli enemy launched an aggression after midnight against the Tal al-Harra area," the SANA news agency said Wednesday, adding that there were reports of damage to property. 2. 6 Iranians Among Dead in Israeli Strike on Southern Syria.

27.07.2019 Six Iranians fighting for the Syrian regime were among those killed in reported Israeli missile strikes in southern Syria this week, the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights has said. Israeli missiles targeted "military positions and intelligence facilities belonging to Iran and (pro-Iranian) militias" in the southern provinces of Daraa and Quneitra, it said. State media also reported that the "Israeli enemy launched an aggression" against military positions held by the government and its allies in Daraa province, without mentioning casualties. 3. Syria's Rukban camp dwindles after five-month Russian siege: residents, aid workers.

The fate of the camp and its residents, living near a Pentagon-run base close to the Jordanian and Iraqi borders, highlights the tussle for influence in the region between Russia and the United States. It also exposes the same strategy of years of bitter siege imposed on former opposition bastions by Moscow and Syrian President Bashar al Assad's forces to push rebels to capitulate. 4. Russia urges BRICS nations to take part in rebuilding Syria.

26.07.2019 Moscow urges all partners in the BRICS group of nations (Brazil, Russia, India, China and South Africa) to take part in work towards post-war restoration of Syria, Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov told a BRICS foreign ministerial session on Friday "It is crucially important to support the processes of Syria's post-conflict restoration. We urge participation in this activity and note in this connection efforts taken by our Chinese and Indian friends," the Russian diplomat said. The main tasks for the settlement in the Arab republic are restoration of sovereignty and territorial integrity, extermination of the remaining terrorists, assistance in the return of refugees with an advance of the political process led by the Syrians themselves in line with Resolution 2254 of the UN Security Council, Lavrov reiterated. 

Russia's call to BRICS countries to take part in post-war reconstruction of Syria, could be seen as the mastermind's attempt to set the scene for the following step which excludes Western role in the Syrian future.

It was assessed that a safe zone under full Turkish control is highly unlikely, yet might be Turkish dominant as part of a US-led coalition in our most recent Crisis Watch. This seems to be under discussion and the parties are far to find a common ground.

The world is apparently indifferent to the humanitarian crisis in Idlib, a densely populated city, under heavy bombardment of the regime forces and Russia. This emboldens Syria and Russia to take over the last rebel-held territory at any price.

5. Crisis In Idlib: Russia And Syria Step Up Airstrikes Against Civilians.

24.07.2019 Syrian and Russian bombing campaign against civilian sites in the rebel-held province intensified on a marketplace in northern Syria, more than 33 people were killed and more than 100 wounded by an airstrike. Syrian and Russian forces also destroyed across two residential blocks in the centre of Maarat al-Numan, while many people reportedly still buried under an apartment building as night fell. The past four months in 2019 have taken an especially brutal toll across much of the province with the Russian-led bombing decimating civilian infrastructure. Rescue efforts were frequently stopped as jets circled the town in the south of Idlib province, the last corner of the country to remain in opposition hands.(Eurasiareview) https://bit.ly/2LSddLV

6. Several Syrian soldiers killed after jihadist suicide attack in Daraa.

27.07.2019 Several Syrian Arab Army (SAA) soldiers were killed on Saturday morning when a jihadist rebel detonated his suicide belt in northeastern Daraa. 
4. Syrian rebels say Moscow deploys ground forces in Idlib campaign.

It is crystal clear that US will never let Turkey to establish a safe zone under its full control, however this safe zone might be materialized by heavy Turkish participation as part of an US-led coalition.

As we assessed earlier, at the end of the day, Syrian regime will highly likely regain the control over Idlib with the support of Russia and Iran, however it will most likely not be so easy and take time due to resistance by opposition groups and factors as the Moscow's delicate game in Syria between Iran and Israel.

Latest developments in middle east especially in Syria are perfect samples of proxy war between the US and Russia, however until now there happened no crucial incidents between these two crucial actors and this is a indication that regardless of their opposing attitudes to Assad, they still share common goals and interests in Syria.

6. Russian, Syrian forces launch largest attack of year on jihadist stronghold.

20.07.2019 The Syrian and Russian forces launched their largest attack of the year over the key town of Khan Sheikhoun in southern Idlib. According to a military source in the nearby Hama Governorate, the Russian and Syrian forces launched more than 30 air and missile strikes on Khan Sheikhoun, hitting several sites belonging to the jihadist rebels of Hay'at Tahrir Al-Sham. The source said the Syrian and Russian forces launched this massive assault on Khan Sheikhoun in response to the heavy attack conducted by Hay'at Tahrir Al-Sham and Jaysh Al-Izza on the government stronghold of Mhardeh the day prior. 

In line with Germany's previous political and military patterns of attitude and behaviour, Germany's decision not to send additional troops to Syria can be considered as stating the obvious. However, in order to maintain good relationship with the U.S., Germany might choose to subsidize monetarily its allies rather than providing troops on the ground.

Long lasting Syrian war could no more be considered as a conflict between the Assad Regime and the rebels, but a show of power between two big powers, the U.S. and Russia. Israeli Prime Minister, giving a speech in front of an F-35 challenging Iran, appears to be also a response to Russian S-400 delivery to Turkey, which reveals the first steps of imminent armament race in the region.

6. Stalled Idlib campaign shows limits of Russia and Syria's power.

14.07.2019 According to the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights, an opposition war monitor, 2,443 people have been killed since April 30. Is Russia behind Syria's security apparatus reform?



The decision of France and UK to send additional special forces to Syria to pick up the slack as US troops withdraw is welcomed as a major victory for the US. Yet, the support seems to be marginal and far from being sufficient. Other Allies, including Germany, seems to turn a blind eye.

Russian backed Syrian Forces is likely to continue their attacks against the Rebel and Jihadi forces in Idlib, paying little attention to humanitarian consequences and the reaction of the international community and Turkey thereof. For the time being, any conflict between Turkey and the Syrian Regime seems unlikely as long as Russia continue to mediate.

As long as the Syrian Regime is unable to control Hezbollah, Israeli air strikes will likely to continue incrementally. Recent Israeli air strikes can be considered as pre-emptive in nature to prevent possible Hezbollah attacks to newly planned settlements in Golan Heights.

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7. The Islamic factions shell positions of the regime forces in the NW of Hama.

07.07.2019 The Islamic factions shell positions of the regime forces and gunmen loyal to them in the north-western countryside of Hama in conjunction with the continued ground and aerial bombardment by the regime's and Russian warplanes on "Putin – Erdogan" area. 

- Recent Israeli air strikes raise doubts about the efficiency and reliability of the Syrian air defence systems which were said to be reinforced by sophisticated Russian missile systems. In this case two options come into mind, either Israel has the technology to get over the Russian missile systems or Russia tolerates Israeli air strikes for some reasons.
- Syrian regime is likely testing the Turkey's reaction by targeting Turkish observation posts in order to move on the next step to control the last remaining parts of north eastern Syria. On the other hand, it should be in mind that Syrian regime can not initiate an attack without Russian consent and the reason of this approval would be a signal to Turkish authorities not to step back about S-400 decision despite pressure from western countries, especially the US.

6. Jihadists suffer tremendous losses in failed attack against Syrian Army.

29.06.2019 Led by Jaysh Al-Izza and Hay'at Tahrir Al-Sham, the jihadist rebels stormed the Syrian Army's defenses at the towns of Jalmeh and Huwayz in north-western Hama. 

Until now, following two different initiatives, the UN and the Astana processes, for the post-war Syrian transition have proved to be of no use. The meeting which is expected to take place between the US, Russia and Israel might be promising as it is crystal clear that no initiative in the region has likelihood of success contrary to each other's will.

The US-Iran confrontation in the Gulf has been picked recently and Israel and US has been pressuring Iran to leave Syria. Turkey has also serious problems regarding the observation points in idlib.

In line with these recent developments it is highly likely that Iran and Turkey will be the losing parties of the long lasting Syrian War.

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6. Russia, Turkey must stabilise Syria's Idlib without delay - UN chief.





The commanders were identified by the group as the former Syrian National Team goalkeeper Abdel-Bassit Sarout, Yasser Al-Hilal, and Mohammad Khaled Al-Sabbagh. A source from the Syrian military said more than half the militant casualties were members of Hay'at Tahrir Al-Sham; this includes a large number of foreign combatants as well. (AMN)

7. Syrian regime bombardment of Idlib kills 10 during Eid.

05.06.2019 Airstrikes and shelling by regime forces killed 10 civilians in Syria's northwest on Wednesday, as residents marked the holiday of Eid al-Fitr, a war monitor said. 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Assessment

•Russia maintains its key position among warring parties in Syria and continues to influence political arena as ISIS threat diminishes and reconstruction phase approaches. However, several factors such as Israel's firm opposition to Iran's presence in Syria, Sunni opposition and SDF presence in the north (backed by Turkey and the U.S. respectively) and existence of some 9 million refugees mostly in the neighbouring states proposed to return to the war-torn country show the volatility of the situation and impracticability of a Pax-Russica.

As its operations wind down along the Euphrates River and Southwest Syria, SAA began concentrating its forces south of Idlib pocket, under Russian GBAD umbrella while holding talks with SDF. Meanwhile, Turkey tries to unite opposition, its sole ally at the theatre, before Idlib offensive commences. However, its relations with the U.S. are at historical low which means it will likely be on its own in the upcoming war. If SAA crushes opposition in the Idlib this will diminish the effect of proxies considerably in the 7-year-long Syrian conflict.

- 7. Russia tests electronic warfare tools on U.S. troops in Syria. 01 August 2018. American troops deployed in Syria are increasingly having to defend themselves against Russian jamming devices—electronic attacks with potentially lethal consequences, according to U.S. military officials and analysts. Officers who have experienced the jamming say it's no less dangerous than conventional attacks with bombs and artillery. But they also say it's allowing U.S. troops a rare opportunity to experience Russian technology in the battlefield and figure out how to defend against it, according to Foreign Policy. 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



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

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Assessment:

- As the Syrian-Russian offensive continues progressively in the southwest, rebels, having lost all their external support, have no option other than to relocate. The regime forces are expected to launch their next major assault to the provincial capital, Daraa city.
- •Several allegations have started spreading around as the Trump-Putin meeting approaches. Iranian and its proxy Hezbollah's presence and Kurdish territorial gains in Syria will likely be the most important topics for the US side whereas Assad's legitimacy will likely appear as the Russian's number one priority. The meeting will also have an impact on the future of Turkish presence in Syria.



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Assessment:

Syrian-Russian offensive in south, which has already triggered a humanitarian disaster, is highly likely result in the transfer of the rebels in Daraa to Idlib soon. Jordan will likely have a huge trouble to deal with this new influx of refugees without the help of international community.

Although U.S. seems that it can live with Assad in the future, for Israel's security it will not tolerate pro-Iran existence in Syria. Israel might act more aggressively in Syrian soil should the situation dictates. U.S. will continue to distance itself from soup of sunni Islamist/extremist fractions gathered under FSA flag which will have dire consequences for the countries that provided and continue to provide safe haven for them.

On the other hand, Russia might push for extending regime's authority to pre-crisis areas at the Helsinki Summit.



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
Assessment:





- Despite Russian testing waters and hard military options utilized by Israel, neither Iran nor its proxy Hezbollah have intention to withdraw from Syria, as they openly expressed. The situation will likely evolve into a direct confrontation with Israel. This can be cushioned by Russian intervention by new incentives for both entities.

- Currently Russia appears as the main actor leading the policies both in Syria and the broader Middle East region. However, Israel's security concerns and its firm stand on Iranian threat clearly dominating the Russian policies in Syria.
- Whether the Southern Front lay down its arms and hand over the area to Syrian Regime or continue fighting will likely be clear following the trilateral meeting between the US-Russia and Jordan, depending on the concerns of Jordan and Israel.
- Cavusoglu Pompeo talks are likely to ease the tensions between Turkey and U.S. over Manbij but will negatively effect Turkish - Russian relations.

- 7.Russia sends latest missile warship near Syria where war games are about to begin. 01 June 2018. Russia has entered its latest missile corvette into service with Moscow's Mediterranean Fleet, a powerful formation of warships involved in the war in Syria and currently preparing for annual summer war games. The relatively small vessel, Buyan-M-class missile corvette Vyshny Volochyok, makes up for what it lacks in size with its high-speed maneuverability and an arsenal of advanced Kalibr-NK cruise missiles capable of hitting targets at sea or land.
